For 2009-2010, the percentage of attrition excluding inter-program transfers is 11%. The 28% noted above includes 2 students who switched to the PhD program. The year of first enrollment includes 5 who transferred from the PhD program, for a cohort size of 16.

For 2010-2011, the percentage of attrition excluding inter-program transfers is 4%. The 29% noted above includes 6 students who switched to the PhD Program. The year of first enrollment includes 3 who transferred from the PhD program, for a cohort size of 18.

For 2011-2012, the percentage of attrition excluding inter-program transfers is 15%. The 40% noted above includes 5 students who switched to the PhD Program. The year of first enrollment includes 2 who transferred from the PhD program, for a cohort size of 15.

For 2012-2013, the percentage of attrition excluding inter-program transfers is 17%. The 42% noted above includes 3 students who switched to the PhD Program. The year of first enrollment includes 2 who transferred from the PhD program, for a cohort size of 9.
