Core Accomplishments

- Wrote and self-published the first book on the future of Asian American ministries in 1991. Several years later, a radically rewritten version--Pursuing the Pearl--was published by Judson Press and continues to be an assigned text in classes on Asian American ministry.
- Created and taught a 10-week course at the beginning of the postmodern shift that was based on cultural insights of Asian Americans; over 500 people took the course in its 10-year run.
- Taught "Asian American Ministries" course twice as a Fuller adjunct based on this book.
- Main Bible expositor for Urbana 2000, speaking daily to over 20,000 conferees with new 'story approach.'
- Rebooted a depleted and discouraged remnant after the church went through a 'friendly split' in 1997. Starting with a third of the original people, a paid-off campus that only had one permanent building, 6-weeks of cash and less than 20% of the former givers, the church today has completed building out the campus and is home to nearly a dozen different API groups (1-4 generations), and people from just about every other group, too.
