FAQ

What is the format of the class? How is the teaching "live"?

The class meets together (i.e., synchronously) for two hours each week. These sessions will be made available via videoconference. Additional assignments will be completed on the student's own schedule.

What if I'm in a (very) different time zone?

Live class meetings will be held in the morning, U.S. Pacific time, to make it possible for students as far away as the East Coast or the United Kingdom to participate.

Are there prerequisites?

Yes. Master's-level Introductory Biblical Hebrew is a prerequisite for all other Semitic language courses. In the Fuller system, this means LG502.

Are there benefits to being in Pasadena even though the courses are online?

Yes. There will be lectures and social gatherings for students who are in Pasadena. Fuller's programs in OT and ANE Studies are known for their camaraderie.

What does each course cost?

Can I take these courses if I'm not a current Fuller student?

How long does the application take?

Can I take these courses without completing a degree at Fuller?

Yes. Students who wish to transfer credit should apply as a "visiting student." Those who do not need to transfer credit or are not enrolled elsewhere should apply for a certificate. Certificates are six courses, but there is no compulsion to complete them if you decide not to pursue your certificate.
